Anyone interested is welcome on the planning committee. Contact Cy Governs at blockparty@lakewalker.org to join our first monthly meeting in June.


LAKE WALKER YARD SALE




HOLLEN WOODS INVASIVE PLANT REMOVAL

In the last issue, I asked if any of our readers have lived or know of anyone who has lived in Lake Walker longer than the McClungs, who moved here in 1965. Well, it turns out that Howard Griffin and his late wife Chris bought their house on Highwood Drive exactly 60 years ago in 1963.

Howard was then working for the Westinghouse Corp., which had been contracted by NASA to design, develop and build a small TV camera capable of filming Neil Armstrong's exit from the Apollo 11 Lunar Module and his first steps on the moon, as narrated by Walter Cronkite on July 20, 1969. The challenges of this endeavor were numerous and difficult, but ultimately successful, as we now know. This fascinating story is a bit too long for this space, but I will be glad to give a copy to anyone who calls me, 410-433-5257.
