

YOU Can Prevent Flooding and Protect the Waterways

e all enjoy the bright colors of Fall and the green of Spring. But how many of us connect that leaves and yard waste impact stormwater systems and the health of local waterways, including our beloved Chesapeake Bay? All of Baltimore's storm drains lead to the Bay.

During and after rainfall, stormwater pushes debris into storm drains. This can cause trouble for homeowners, stormwater systems, and our waterways. We need your help to keep our streets clean and our storm drains unblocked!

When debris blocks a drain, the water backs up and, if there's enough rain, can damage properties. Several Lake Walker residents recently experienced terrible flooding.

Biological debris — leaves, sticks, etc. — contains phosphorus. When it rains on this debris, phosphorus quickly leaches out (imagine a tea bag in water) and makes its way to our local waterways through the sewers and waterways — like the streams Jim writes about in "Around the 'Hood" (at right).

Too much phosphorus causes unsightly and potentially dangerous algae blooms. Water turns green and smelly, and its oxygen level decreases. This is bad for plants and animals (including people!) that live in and near our waterways. Including people! Especially if the waterway is used for the public water supply or for recreation. Our local fish and crab populations can't thrive when nutrient-fueled algal blooms choke the waterways.

What can you do?

Use leaves, lawn clippings, and other biological debris for mulch around gardens and borders. While not good for the Bay, plant debris is excellent for your soil and builds a rich, nutritious soil for flowers and vegetables.

2 Don't push leaves or other biological debris into the street. Pack it up (ideally in brown paper bags) and set the bags out for trash pickup.



Add plant debris to your compost bin or pile.

4 If you see trash, pick it up and dispose of it properly. Thank you to the many residents who regularly do this to keep Lake Walker's streets and green spaces clean!

Together we can keep the neighborhood beautiful, prevent property damage, and protect the health of the streams, harbor, and Chesapeake Bay.



Around the 'Hood

Did you know that there are three streams running through Lake Walker? As you drive along Walker Ave. from York Rd. to the Alameda, they form the three low points you encounter.

Clearspring: This is the former name of the smallest. It is what's known as a "phantom" stream because it's completely piped underground. It originates west of York Rd. near Pinehurst Rd. and flows behind the houses along Schwartz Ave. It passes under York Rd. near Wells Discount Liquors, then by the Walgreens entrance. It crosses under Walker Ave. at the lowest point behind the Edge of Charm Airbnb, flowing behind the houses along (what else) Clearspring Rd. It is pretty easy to follow its underground path down to where it empties into Chinguapin Run south of Northern Pkwy.

Walker Run: This is probably the most familiar for many of you. It drains much of Anneslie, comes above ground at Walker Ave., and flows two blocks down to Cedarcroft Rd., where it becomes a phantom again and goes underground. It eventually empties into Chinquapin Run at Northwood Dr. You can see it at the dead end of Hollen Rd. This waterway is a big reason why we've invested in cleaning up Hollen Woods.

Chinquapin Run: This largest of the three streams drains much of Stoneleigh, Anneslie, and a bit of Idlewylde. It comes above ground at Walker Ave., then flows behind our neighbors on the east side of Northwood Dr. It empties into Herring Run near Morgan University.




